## WIN Time has begun!

This year we are implementing WIN Time. WIN stands for “What I Need.” During WIN Time each day, provide students with reading interventions or enrichment to help them get precisely what they need to become better readers. Ask your kids about their learning goals.

## What's the angle?

Learning about angles is an important step in understanding geometry. Try these suggestions with your youngster:

- Help her or him use their arms to demonstrate angles. For a right angle, she or he can stretch their left arm straight up and their right arm straight out to their side. An acute angle is smaller, so have her or him move their arms closer together. And an obtuse angle is larger than a right angle, so she or he should move their arms wider.
- Next, see how many angles your child can find in the alphabet. Have her or him print all 26 uppercase letters on a large sheet of paper. With different-colored markers, have her or him mark right angles (one in “L,” for example), acute angles (three in “A”), and obtuse angles (two in “X”).
- Together, look for angles in the real world. Right angles will be easiest to find—they'll be in corners of rooms where one wall meets another, on window frames, or at the edge of a square sandbox.

But your youngster will also be able to find angles that are acute (spokes in a bicycle wheel) and obtuse (a door that's wide open). Suggest that she or he make a three-column chart (name of object, type of angle, sketch of the angle) to record her or his findings.
